

## Chapter 8.45 Truck Routes

**8.45.010 Purpose and Policy.** This chapter is intended to implement the City’s authority in ORS 227.400 to designate truck routes through the City.

**8.45.020 Definitions:** For purposes of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply to the City of Mosier and this chapter:

- A. “Delivery trucks” or “service trucks” mean those trucks that deliver freight, fuel or other property within the City of Mosier or are required for the providing of service within the City.
- B. “Emergency vehicles” means those vehicles providing public emergency services, such as fire trucks and any vehicle defined by state law as an emergency vehicle, with a combined weight in excess of 6,000 lbs.
- C. “Motor truck” means every motor vehicle designed or used for carrying, conveying or moving over the streets and highways any freight, property, article or thing with a combined vehicle weight and maximum load limit of more than 6,000 lbs.

**8.45.030 Truck Route Designated.** There is hereby established a truck route beginning at the point where the last boundary of the City of Mosier bisects Third Street and continuing generally west to the point where Washington Street and Third Street intersect, then continuing generally north on Washington Street to the point where Washington Street intersects with Old Highway 30 and continuing either east or west on Old Highway 30 until reaching the eastern or western boundary of the City. The City shall post suitable signs to indicate the designated Truck Route that are clearly visible to traffic traveling in both directions.

**8.45.040 Use of Truck Route Required.** It shall be unlawful for any delivery, service or motor trucks to drive on any street or highway in Mosier that is not a designated truck route unless the truck is an emergency vehicle or serving (delivering to or picking up from) a specific property in the City. A special permit may be granted by the City Engineer upon application and for good cause shown, taking into account the considerations set forth in MMC chapter 8.05.

**8.45.050** **Parking Prohibited on Truck Route.** It shall be unlawful for anyone to park any motor vehicle, trailer or any other object within the public right-of-way on the east half of Washington Street between Third Street and Old Highway 30.
